Background

The National Malaria Programme under the Global Fund grant aims to strengthen malaria vector surveillance, monitoring, and control activities in high-burden states. Robust entomological surveillance is essential for guiding evidence-based vector control strategies. To support these goals, dedicated Entomologists will be deployed across key entomological zones to enhance field and laboratory entomological activities.

Objectives of the Assignment

The Entomologist will support and strengthen:

- Entomological surveillance
- Monitoring of vector bionomics and behavior
- Assessment of insecticide susceptibility/resistance
- Quality assurance and supervision of vector control interventions
- Evidence-based planning and decision-making at state and district levels

Roles and Responsibilities

The Entomologist will perform the following key tasks:

A. Entomological Surveillance

1. Conduct field-based surveillance of malaria vectors, including:
 - Mosquito collections and identification
 - Larval/pupal surveys
 - Monitoring resting/feeding behavior of adult mosquitoes
 - Longitudinal studies on Species composition and monitoring of Vector density.
2. Undertake insecticide susceptibility/resistance testing following national guidelines.
3. Support mapping of vector breeding habitats and ecology.

B. Laboratory Work

1. Perform laboratory identification of vector species using morphological keys or other approved methods.
2. Assist in determining susceptibility/resistance status of vectors. molecular/biochemical assays (if applicable).
3. Ensure proper maintenance of entomological equipment and laboratory supplies.

C. Vector Control Monitoring

1. Support monitoring and evaluation of vector control interventions (IRS, LLIN distribution/use, larval source management, etc.).
2. Conduct cone bioassays and other quality assurance tests for IRS and LLINs.
3. Document insecticide resistance patterns and support development of mitigation strategies.

D. Data Management & Reporting

1. Maintain accurate records of field and laboratory observations.
2. Analyze entomological data and generate monthly/quarterly reports.
3. Provide inputs for district/state malaria action plans based on entomological findings.
4. Present findings to state/district programme officials and technical partners.

E. Capacity Building

1. Provide on-the-job training to field staff on entomological surveillance techniques.
2. Assist state/district malaria teams in strengthening entomology-focused operations.

F. Coordination & Support

1. Liaise with state/district malaria officers, laboratories, and technical agencies.
2. Participate in review meetings, training sessions, and technical consultations.
3. Ensure adherence to national Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) and programme guidelines.
